Landowners within the proposed drainage district and Dodge County Drainage Board filed plans with Dodge County Circuit Court in August 2010 and requested an order to organize Drainage District 88.

Opponents of the district subsequently filed objections to the drainage plans based on impairment of surface water resources and potential harm to aquatic habitat of Spring Brook creek. The creek is listed on the Wisconsin Natural Heritage Inventory for aquatic resources. It is also a tributary of the Rock River, which is the primary water source of Lake Sinissippi.

The lake district, Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources and Springbrook Estate filed separate objections to the original drainage plans.
